**Inspector or Senior/Lead Inspector (Reimbursable Detail Opportunity)
Office of Inspector General for the Export-Import Bank of the United States**

Duty Location: Washington, DC (Telework Eligible)

The Office of Inspector General (OIG) for the Export-Import Bank of the United States (EXIM) is seeking a qualified individual (GS-13 or GS-14) within the Inspector General community to serve on detail as an Inspector (GS-13) or Senior/Lead Inspector (GS-14) to assist OIG's new Office of Special Reviews (OSR) in conducting timely inspections, evaluations, and special studies or reviews of EXIM programs, operations, or other activities based on interests or requests from the Inspector General or other sources, such as OIG Hotline contacts, Congress, or the media.

This detail is a six-month to one-year assignment and is eligible for telework. Travel, to include international travel, may be required. Top Secret clearance required. More than one candidate may be selected.

EXIM serves as the official export credit agency of the United States, supporting American jobs and exporters by facilitating the financing of U.S. goods and services in international markets. EXIM recently expanded its programs and operations to include the China and Transformational Exports program and a domestic financing initiative called Make More in America. EXIM OIG conducts audits, investigations, inspections, and evaluations that provide independent oversight of more than \$5.8 billion in annual authorized transactions in support of nearly \$10 billion in export sales and 39,000 American jobs.

Duties

The detailed position is primarily responsible for:

- Planning, developing, directing, and conducting OIG inspections, evaluations, special projects, or reviews, ensuring the promotion of economy, efficiency, and effectiveness, as well as the prevention and detection of fraud, waste, abuse, or mismanagement, of EXIM programs, operations, or other activities;
- Conducting interviews with EXIM officials and other third parties;
- Writing, editing, and reviewing reports, memoranda, and other OIG work products;
- Applying inspection and evaluation methodologies and techniques in accordance with Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation (Blue Book) standards, as well as formulating OIG recommendations to keep EXIM officials and Congress fully and currently informed about any findings or deficiencies related to EXIM programs, operations, or other activities;
- Collaborating effectively with other OIG Directorates; and,
- Representing OIG at meetings with EXIM management staff, congressional staff, and outside entities.
